Our application for the Fellowship was approved on its initial submission, which is a great accomplishment. The importance of this cannot be overstated. Hospice of East Texas has already begun to train the next generation of medical professionals in the extraordinary kind of care we are able to offer... Texas Palliative Care services continue to expand. A hospital based in-patient consultation service was initiated in August, at CHRISTUS Good Shepherd Medical Center, in Longview. - Hospice of East Texas received the Hospice CAHPS (Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems) Award of Distinction from SHP (Strategic Healthcare Programs) in 2022, recognizing Hospice of East Texas' superior performance scoring above the national average for each Hospice quality measure from the caregiver's point of view.


OUR MISSION
