

Consolidated Financial Snapshot




HOET staff held a volunteer appreciation drive thru and invited volunteers to drive thru (masked) to say hello and get a sweet treat

Friends & volunteers rallied with donations of all kinds to encourage HOET staf










COVID-19 made visiting dear friends and family members nearly impossible in some cases, but HOET staff tried every possible alternative to allow visitation while following CDC guidelines.
