# TEXAS PALLIATIVE CARE

The growth of **Texas Palliative Care**, a company created by The Hospice of East Texas, and their community service **Pathways** was significant. Texas Palliative Care (TPC) consultation services have been available at CHRISTUS and



UT Health East Texas in Tyler for six years. Services were expanded into CHRISTUS Good Shepherd in September of 2022. That service, as well as TPC clinics in Tyler and Longview, grew to serve a record number of patients in 2023.

### When should someone seek palliative care?

According to Dr. Jason Holman, one of our board-certified palliative care physicians, "Anytime a patient is diagnosed with a serious illness, they could benefit from seeing a palliative care doctor. Also, patients who are admitted to the ICU, because by definition, that is a serious medical condition, could be well-served by a conversation with a palliative care specialist".

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
# **Our Mission**
